31,124 verses in the Bible

8,352 verses are predictive in nature

28.5% of the verses in the Old Testament are prophetic

27% of the verses in the Bible are prophetic

1 out of 4 verses in the Bible is prophetic in nature

Number of Prophecies in the Bible

There are 8,352 verses predictive in nature.

These verses present 1,817 predictions. Many of these 1,817 predictions are repeated in different books of the Bible.

Removing the redundancy of the prophecies, there are 737 separate, unique predictions in the Bible.

THE 291 PROPHECIES OF MOSES

2,007 of 5,852 Verses

GENESIS: 212 of 1,533 verses are prophetic in nature = 14% of book. There are 77 distinct prophecies. 22 of the 77 prophecies are to be fulfilled by Christ or 28% of the prophecies.

EXODUS: 487 of 1,213 verses or 40% is predictive in nature. There are 69 distinct predictions. 29 of the 69 prophecies are fulfilled in Christ or 42% of the prophecies.

LEVITICUS: 506 of 859 verses or 59% involves prophecy. There are 37 distinct prophecies. 28 of the 37 prophecies are fulfilled in Christ or 76% of the prophecies.

NUMBERS: 458 of 1,288 verses or 36% is prophetic. There are 50 separate predictions. 25 of the 50 prophecies are fulfilled in Christ or 50% of the prophecies.

DEUTERONOMY: 344 of 959 verses or 36% is predictive in nature. There are 58 specific prophecies. 17 of the 58 prophecies are fulfilled in Christ or 29% of the prophecies.

THE 291 PROPHECIES OF MOSES

2,007 of 5,852 Verses

1. 1 out of 3 verses in the Pentateuch are prophetic in nature (34%)
2. 291 of the 737 unique prophecies are found in the Pentateuch (39%)
3. 121 of the 291 prophecies in Pentateuch are fulfilled in Christ (42%)
4. 66 of those 121 prophecies are unique prophecies, the other 55 prophecies are repeated predictions.
5. 56 of those 66 unique prophecies about Christ are in the form of typology (84%)
6. 56 of the 66 unique prophecies were fulfilled in Christ's first coming (84%)
7. 10 of the 66 unique prophecies are to be fulfilled at His second coming (16%)

THE 291 PROPHECIES OF MOSES

56 of the 66 Prophecies of Christ in the Form of Typology

1. Typology using people: Adam, Melchizedek, Isaac, Levitical Priests, High Priest
2. Typology using objects: Noah's ark, altars, pillar cloud, Red Sea, Manna, water from the rock, tabernacle, priest's clothing, atonement money, bronze serpent
3. Typology using animals: Passover lamb, two goats, two birds, red heifer, animal sacrifices, animal skins
4. Typology using covenants: Noah, Abraham, Moses, Covenant of Peace with Phinehas
5. Typology using the calendar/holy days: Sabbath, Passover, Unleavened Bread, Firstfruits, Pentecost, Trumpets, Day of Atonement, Tabernacles, Jubilee
6. Typology using ceremonies: Giving of tithes, circumcision, priest's cleansing and consecration

John 5:45 - THE IRONY

**Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father:
there is *one* that accuseth you, *even Moses*, in whom ye trust.**

**For had ye believed *Moses*, ye would have believed me:
for he wrote of me.**

John 5:47 - THE IMPLICATION

But if ye believe not his writings, how shall ye believe my words?

Jesus ascribed Mosaic Authorship to Pentateuch - DEUTERONOMY

DEUTERONOMY 24:1-4 - MATTHEW 19:7-8 (Topic of Divorce)

They say unto him, Why did Moses then command to give a writing of divorcement, and to put her away? He saith unto them, Moses because of the hardness of your hearts suffered you to put away your wives: but from the beginning it was not so.

DEUTERONOMY 25:5-10 - MATTHEW 22:24 (Topic of Children)

Saying, Master, Moses said, If a man die, having no children, his brother shall marry his wife, and raise up seed unto his brother.

PROPHECIES IN DEUTERONOMY

Of the 959 verses in Deuteronomy, 344 of them are predictive in nature (36%).

There are 58 specific prophecies. Of the 58 prophecies, 17 of them are fulfilled in Christ (29%).

#1 - The Mosaic Covenant (11/58)

Deuteronomy 4:13, 23; 5:2-3; 9:9, 11, 15; 17:2; 29:1, 9-15, 21; 33:9

**Deuteronomy 4:13,
And he declared unto you his covenant, which he
commanded you to perform, *even* ten commandments;
and he wrote them upon two tables of stone.**

#2 - The Abrahamic Covenant (17/58)

Deuteronomy 4:31; 7:9, 12; 8:18

**Deuteronomy 4:31,
(For the LORD thy God *is* a merciful God;) he will not forsake thee, neither destroy thee, nor forget the covenant of thy fathers which he sware unto them.**

#8 - The Typology of the Sacrifices (30/58)

Deuteronomy 15:21; 17:1; 33:19b

Deuteronomy 15:21,

And if there be *any* blemish therein, *as if it be* lame, or blind, *or have* any ill blemish, thou shalt not sacrifice it unto the LORD thy God.

#9 - The Typology of the Passover (31/58)

Deuteronomy 16:1-2a, 4, 6b-7a

**Deuteronomy 16:1,
Observe the month of Abib, and keep the passover unto
the LORD thy God: for in the month of Abib the LORD thy
God brought thee forth out of Egypt by night.**

#11 - The Typology of the Priests (34/58)

Deuteronomy 18:1-5; 26:3a, 4

Deuteronomy 18:1,

The priests the Levites, *and* all the tribe of Levi, shall have no part nor inheritance with Israel: they shall eat the offerings of the LORD made by fire, and his inheritance.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Deuteronomy #12 - The Prophet Like Unto Moses (35/58)

Deuteronomy 18:15,

The LORD thy God will raise up unto thee a Prophet from the midst of thee, of thy brethren, like unto me; unto him ye shall hearken;

Deuteronomy 18:18-19,

I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee, and will put my words in his mouth; and he shall speak unto them all that I shall command him. (18:19) And it shall come to pass, *that* whosoever will not hearken unto my words which he shall speak in my name, I will require *it* of him.

List of similarities between Moses and Jesus

- 1. The major point of parallel is that they were both prophets. They both spoke the Word of God.**
- 2. Both were born of poor parents under a tyrant's rule.**
- 3. Both were preserved from death in infancy, while others were slain.**
- 4. Both spent many years in humble toil: as a shepherd and as a carpenter.**
- 5. Both demonstrated their calling by great miracles.**
- 6. Both were very meek (Numbers 12:3; Matthew 11:29; 21:5).**
- 7. Both were rejected by their people, Israel.**

The Prophet like unto Moses

List of similarities between Moses and Jesus

- 8. Both rejected the easy way: Pharaoh's daughter and Satan's temptation.**
- 9. Both made the sea obey them, The Red Sea and the Sea of Galilee.**
- 10. Both their faces shone with glory; at Sinai; at the Mount of Transfiguration.**
- 11. Both fed thousands miraculously.**
- 12. They were the only two divinely authorized lawgivers the world has ever seen.**

List of similarities between Moses and Jesus

13. Both were teachers (Deuteronomy 4:5; Matthew 22:16).
14. Both were judges (Exodus 18:13; John 5:22).
15. Both were redeemers (Exodus 3:10; Isaiah 59:20; Galatians 4:4-5).
16. Both were mediators (Deuteronomy 5:5, 25-28; I Timothy 2:5; Hebrews 9:15).
17. Both were intercessors (Numbers 14:13, 18-20; Isaiah 53:12; Hebrews 7:25).
18. Both were leaders (Exodus 32:34; Isaiah 55:4; John 10:3-4).
19. Both were kings (Deuteronomy 33:5; Matthew 2:2; 27:37).

The Ways Jesus is Superior to Moses

- 1. Moses was only a sinful man, a servant; Christ is the perfect, divine Son (Hebrews 3:1-6).**
- 2. Moses could not lead Israel into the land; Christ gives total victory (Matthew 28:18; Hebrews 10:19-20).**
- 3. Moses miracles were of judgment; Christ's were of healing and blessing (Quantity and quality of miracles)**
- 4. Moses delivered the Jews; Christ's redemption is universal and is physical and spiritual (I John 2:1-2).**
- 5. Moses communicated the Law; Christ, grace (John 1:17; Hebrews 7:19).**

THE MINISTRY OF PROPHECYING

THE MEANING OF “PROPHECYING”

- 1) Foretelling Truth - Predictive in nature**
- 2) Forth-telling Truth - Expository and applicational in nature**

Prophets exposed national sins, explained their implications and consequences, delineated the biblical reactions to sin and then gave hope to the nation if the nation repented and turned back to God.

THE SUPREME COURT HEARING REGARDING SAME SEX MARRIAGES

OBERGEFELL V. HODGES - Decided on June 26, 2015
The Fourteenth Amendment requires States to recognize same-sex marriages validly performed out of State. Since same-sex couples may now exercise the fundamental right to marry in all States, there is no lawful basis for a State to refuse to recognize a lawful same-sex marriage performed in another State on the ground of its same-sex character.

THE FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT

Section 1. All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

EZEKIEL 8 - ISRAEL'S SUPREME COURT DECISIONS BEFORE ISRAEL'S FALL IN 586 BC

Ezekiel 8:11-12,

And there stood before them seventy men of the ancients of the house of Israel, and in the midst of them stood Jaazaniah the son of Shaphan, with every man his censer in his hand; and a thick cloud of incense went up. (8:12) Then said he unto me, Son of man, hast thou seen what the ancients of the house of Israel do in the dark, every man in the chambers of his imagery? for they say, The LORD seeth us not; the LORD hath forsaken the earth.

Ezekiel 8:18,

Therefore will I also deal in fury: mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity: and though they cry in mine ears with a loud voice, yet will I not hear them.

MATTHEW - ISRAEL'S SUPREME COURT DECISIONS BEFORE THEIR FALL IN AD 70

Matthew 27:1,

When the morning was come, all the chief priests and elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death:

Luke 23:51,

(The same had not consented to the counsel and deed of them;) *he was* of Arimathaea, a city of the Jews: who also himself waited for the kingdom of God.
