John 5:45 - THE IRONY

Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father:
there is *one* that accuseth you, *even Moses*, in whom ye trust.

John 5:46 - THE INSPIRATION

For had ye believed *Moses*, ye would have believed me:
for he wrote of me.

John 5:47 - THE IMPLICATION

But if ye believe not his writings, how shall ye believe my words?

Percentage of Bible Prophetic in Nature

31,124 verses in the Bible

8,352 verses are predictive in nature

28.5% of the verses in the Old Testament are prophetic

21.5% of the verses in the New Testament are prophetic

27% of the verses in the Bible are prophetic

1 out of 4 verses in the Bible is prophetic in nature

Number of Prophecies in the Bible

There are 8,352 verses predictive in nature.

These verses present 1,817 predictions. Many of these 1,817 predictions are repeated in different books of the Bible.

Removing the redundancy of the prophecies, there are 737 separate, unique predictions in the Bible.

The Different Literary Forms Used in Biblical Prophecies

- 1. Verbal forms - simple oracles seen in normal, customary language, explicit predictions = 1,183**
- 2. Verbal forms using figurative language = 168**
- 3. Non-verbal forms - symbolic predictions as seen in object lessons, dreams = 86**
- 4. Non-verbal forms seen in typology = 380**

Total: 1,817 prophecies

The Four Most Repeated Prophecies

- 1. The Typology of the Tabernacle/Temple prefiguring the Incarnation of Christ (32/66 books - 936 verses).**
- 2. The Typology of Judah's fall to Babylon prefiguring God's Judgment of Unbelief and Sin (17/66 books - 608 verses).**
- 3. The Typology of the Sacrifices prefiguring Christ's atoning death at His First Coming (29/66 books - 151 verses)**
- 4. Christ's Second Coming (29/66 - 63 verses) and His Millennial Reign over the earth (20/66 books - 63 verses).**

83% of the Prophecies Already Fulfilled

83% of the prophecies have been fulfilled or 610 of the 737 prophecies.

17% of the prophecies were fulfilled at Christ's First Coming or 127 prophecies.

17% of the prophecies remain unfulfilled. These 1,556 verses describing 127 prophecies will be fulfilled in events surrounding Christ's Second Coming.

Jesus ascribed Mosaic Authorship to Pentateuch - LEVITICUS

LEVITICUS 14:2 - MATTHEW 8:4,

And Jesus saith unto him, See thou tell no man; but go thy way, shew thyself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them.

LEVITICUS 12:2 - LUKE 2:22

And when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present *him* to the Lord;

THE 291 PROPHECIES OF MOSES

2,007 of 5,852 Verses

GENESIS: 212 of 1,533 verses are prophetic in nature = 14% of book. There are 77 distinct prophecies. 22 of the 77 prophecies are to be fulfilled by Christ or 28% of the prophecies.

EXODUS: 487 of 1,213 verses or 40% is predictive in nature. There are 69 distinct predictions. 29 of the 69 prophecies are fulfilled in Christ or 42% of the prophecies.

LEVITICUS: 506 of 859 verses or 59% involves prophecy. There are 37 distinct prophecies. 28 of the 37 prophecies are fulfilled in Christ or 76% of the prophecies.

NUMBERS: 458 of 1,288 verses or 36% is prophetic. There are 50 separate predictions.

DEUTERONOMY: 344 of 959 verses or 36% is predictive in nature. There are 58 specific prophecies.

Leviticus 8:33,

And ye shall not go out of the door of the tabernacle of the congregation *in* seven days, until the days of your consecration be at an end: for seven days shall he consecrate you.

Leviticus 8:6, 11b; 16:4b, 24a

**Leviticus 8:6,
And Moses brought Aaron and his sons, and washed them
with water.**

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus 10/37 - Typology of the Priest's Garments

Leviticus 8:7, 13; 16:4a, 23

Leviticus 8:7,

And he put upon him the coat, and girded him with the girdle, and clothed him with the robe, and put the ephod upon him, and he girded him with the curious girdle of the ephod, and bound *it* unto him therewith.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus 11/37 - Typology of the Golden Mitre Plate

Leviticus 8:9,

And he put the mitre upon his head; also upon the mitre, *even* upon his forefront, did he put the golden plate, the holy crown; as the LORD commanded Moses.

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What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus 12/37 - Typology of the Anointed Oil on Altar

Leviticus 8:11a,

And he sprinkled thereof upon the altar seven times, and anointed the altar and all his vessels, both the laver and his foot, to sanctify them.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus 13/37 - Typology of Circumcision

Leviticus 12:3,

And in the eighth day the flesh of his foreskin shall be circumcised.

Leviticus 12:4,

And she shall then continue in the blood of her purifying three and thirty days; she shall touch no hallowed thing, nor come into the sanctuary, until the days of her purifying be fulfilled.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus 14/37 - Typology of the Two Birds in the Ceremony for Cleansing Lepers

Leviticus 14:4-7, 49-53

(14:4) Then shall the priest command to take for him that is to be cleansed two birds alive *and* clean, and cedar wood, and scarlet, and hyssop: ⁵ And the priest shall command that one of the birds be killed in an earthen vessel over running water: ⁶ As for the living bird, he shall take it, and the cedar wood, and the scarlet, and the hyssop, and shall dip them and the living bird in the blood of the bird *that was* killed over the running water: ⁷ And he shall sprinkle upon him that is to be cleansed from the leprosy seven times, and shall pronounce him clean, and shall let the living bird loose into the open field.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus 18/37 - The Typology of the Day of Atonement (The Scapegoat)

Leviticus 16:10, But the goat, on which the lot fell to be the scapegoat, shall be presented alive before the LORD, to make an atonement with him, *and* to let him go for a scapegoat into the wilderness.

Leviticus 16:20, And when he hath made an end of reconciling the holy *place*, and the tabernacle of the congregation, and the altar, he shall bring the live goat: ²¹ And Aaron shall lay both his hands upon the head of the live goat, and confess over him all the iniquities of the children of Israel, and all their transgressions in all their sins, putting them upon the head of the goat, and shall send *him* away by the hand of a fit man into the wilderness: ²² And the goat shall bear upon him all their iniquities unto a land not inhabited: and he shall let go the goat in the wilderness.

Leviticus 16:26, And he that let go the goat for the scapegoat shall wash his clothes, and bathe his flesh in water, and afterward come into the camp.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus 19/37 - The Typology of the Day of Atonement (the animal sacrifices)

Leviticus 16:12-19, 29-34; 23:26-32

Leviticus 16:15,

Then shall he kill the goat of the sin offering, that *is* for the people, and bring his blood within the vail, and do with that blood as he did with the blood of the bullock, and sprinkle it upon the mercy seat, and before the mercy seat:

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus

20/37 - The Life is in the Blood

Leviticus 17:10, And whatsoever man *there be* of the house of Israel, or of the strangers that sojourn among you, that eateth any manner of blood; I will even set my face against that soul that eateth blood, and will cut him off from among his people. ¹¹ For the life of the flesh *is* in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it *is* the blood *that* maketh an atonement for the soul. ¹² Therefore I said unto the children of Israel, No soul of you shall eat blood, neither shall any stranger that sojourneth among you eat blood. ¹³ And whatsoever man *there be* of the children of Israel, or of the strangers that sojourn among you, which hunteth and catcheth any beast or fowl that may be eaten; he shall even pour out the blood thereof, and cover it with dust. ¹⁴ For *it is* the life of all flesh; the blood of it *is* for the life thereof: therefore I said unto the children of Israel, Ye shall eat the blood of no manner of flesh: for the life of all flesh *is* the blood thereof: whosoever eateth it shall be cut off.

In the fourteenth *day* of the first month at even *is* the LORD'S passover.

Leviticus 23:33-36, 39-43

Leviticus 23:34,
Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, The fifteenth day of this seventh month *shall be* the feast of tabernacles *for* seven days unto the LORD.

Leviticus 23:39, . . . when ye have gathered in the fruit of the land, ye shall keep a feast unto the LORD seven days: on the first day *shall be* a sabbath, and on the eighth day *shall be* a sabbath.

**And ye shall hallow the fiftieth year, and proclaim liberty
throughout *all* the land unto all the inhabitants thereof: it
shall be a jubile unto you; and ye shall return every man
unto his possession, and ye shall return every man unto
his family.**

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus

#26 - 31/37 - The Covenant

Leviticus 26:9-12,

For I will have respect unto you, and make you fruitful, and multiply you, and establish my covenant with you.

¹⁰ And ye shall eat old store, and bring forth the old because of the new. ¹¹ And I will set my tabernacle among you: and my soul shall not abhor you. ¹² And I will walk among you, and will be your God, and ye shall be my people.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus

#27 - 32/37 - The Covenant Blessings/Curses

Leviticus 26:15,

And if ye shall despise my statutes, or if your soul abhor my judgments, so that ye will not do all my commandments, *but* that ye break my covenant:

Leviticus 26:44,

And yet for all that, when they be in the land of their enemies, I will not cast them away, neither will I abhor them, to destroy them utterly, and to break my covenant with them: for I *am* the LORD their God.

Leviticus 26:45,

But I will for their sakes remember the covenant of their ancestors, whom I brought forth out of the land of Egypt in the sight of the heathen, that I might be their God: I *am* the LORD.

What Moses Wrote About Jesus in Leviticus #28 - 36/37 - The Abrahamic Covenant

Leviticus 26:42,

Then will I remember my covenant with Jacob, and also my covenant with Isaac, and also my covenant with Abraham will I remember; and I will remember the land.

“FOR HE WROTE OF ME”

Leviticus 1-7 = The Redeemer will be the ultimate sacrifice for sin

Leviticus 8-10 = The Redeemer will be the ultimate High Priest that mediates between God and man

Leviticus 16 = The Redeemer expiates and propitiates sin

Leviticus 23 = The Redeemer is the ultimate Feast
